I don't know if any side bets were wagered, but I heard one person who didn't shoot very well was going to buy some refreshments for his buddies after all the shooting was done.

The only criticism I heard was about the targets being painted black. Normally that is the color they are when we hold our sanctioned IHMSA silhouette matches. So we didn't think anything of it. But, at the next fun shoot we may try different colors and see what the people like best. We want everybody to enjoy themselves and want to come back again and again.

All in all everybody who I talked to said they had a lot of fun and wondered when the next one will be held. We're not sure about the date yet, but we do plan on having another fun shoot in the spring. When we decide when it will be, we'll be sure to give everybody plenty of notice.
